FOCUS AREAS OF ASCD LONG-RANGE PLANNING

Education and Care of Young Children. After considering population, social, and learning trends, ASCD identified the education and care of young children as a major program emphasis in its strategic plan. The topic of "public school programs for four- and five-year-old children" was the theme of a mini-conference on 9-11 December 1987 in Alexandria, Virginia. Audiotapes of the major presentations will be available. An expert panel will meet in January 1988 to consider the issues around programming for this age group. Project Facilitator: Cynthia Warger, Director of Program Development.

Teaching Thinking. Some 28 education organizations convened by ASCD have agreed to work together to promote teaching thinking in schools. In January ASCD will publish one of the products of that effort, *Dimensions of Thinking*, as a comprehensive member book. During the 1987-88 year, the collaborative will hold several small meetings to develop position statements on such matters as administrative leadership, teacher education, instructional materials, and program evaluation. Results will be reported in ASCD publications. Leadership/Supervision. The Executive Council has authorized a task force, chaired by Gerald Firth, to develop a plan for recognizing key competencies in supervision. The first meeting was held in November. Project Facilitator: Gordon Cawelti, Executive Director.

Restructuring Education. This year ASCD is planning a consortium of schools engaged in restructuring education, and will focus several NCSIs and publications on this area of the strategic plan. Project Facilitator: Diane G. Berreth, Director of Field Services.

CURRENT PROJECTS

ASCD Networks. ASCD is currently sponsoring thirteen networks: Arts in Education, Network and Clearinghouse for Cooperative Learning, Clearinghouse on Learning/Teaching Styles and Brain Behavior, Curriculum Teachers Network, Designing District Evaluation Instruments for Math & Science Process Skills, Educational Futurists, Instructional Supervision, Net-

work for Equity Issues and Women in Educational Leadership, Network for Self-Directed Learning, Network on Teaching Thinking, Northwest Vermont Outcomes-Based-Mastery Network, Social Issues and Education Network, and Staff Development Network. Curriculum Trends Studies. ASCD has undertaken a series of longitudinal studies of elementary, middle, and secondary school curriculum trends that will be repeated in five-year cycles. The elementary study and the secondary study were reported in *Curriculum Update* in April 1985 and August 1986. Moral Education Policy Panel. An expert panel of educators met at ASCD October 14-15, 1987, and is currently preparing a paper on moral education to be released in May. The panel will delineate the relationship of morality to religion, outline a process by which schools can engage their communities in selecting values to be taught, describe effective curricular practices in moral education, and make recommendations to ASCD members that will guide their practice at the local level. CONSORTIUMS

Elementary Consortium on Teaching Thinking. With ASCD encouragement, teams representing 25 elementary schools from across the nation are engaged in a two-year effort to improve the teaching of thinking in their schools. Highlights of Consortium meetings will be reported in *Update*, and a book is planned later. Project Facilitator: Ron Brandt, Executive Editor.

Middle School Futures Consortium.

In October, 25 middle-level schools from around the nation launched a two-year effort to assist middle school faculties in designing education appropriate to the future lives of students. Each school will produce a long-range plan for organizing the school, improving the core curriculum, improving teaching, and better use of educational technology. High School Futures Consortium.

Teams from the 27 high schools selected to participate began training in Colorado in July to develop individual long-range plans for their schools in the areas of curriculum, school organization, improving teaching, and the use of educational technology. Videotape Training Materials

Teacher Performance Evaluation Cycle. This video training program provides a research-based procedure for formative and summative evaluation, demonstrates the procedure in a real classroom, then allows the trainees to practice the evaluation procedure during selected teaching episodes and compare their ratings to those of an expert panel and national norms. The two-tape set introducing the evaluation procedure sells for \$395 to ASCD members and \$445 to nonmembers. The four-tape set of teaching episodes sells for \$395 to members and \$445 to nonmembers. Tapes are accompanied by Leader's Guides and Instructional Materials Booklets.

Another Set of Eyes. This new two-part program is designed for use in workshops and explains techniques for turning classroom observations into learning experiences for teachers by providing them with specific and nonjudgmental information to help them relate more effectively to their students. Facilitator's Manual and both tapes available to ASCD members for \$395, nonmembers for \$445.
