ASCD'S OUTSTANDING DISSERTATION AWARDS

Anyone whose dissertation was completed and approved during the academic year September 1, 1989, to August 31, 1990, from an institution of higher education sanctioned by a regional accrediting agency may enter ASCD's Outstanding Dissertation Awards competition. Established a decade ago to recognize the importance of doctoral research as a source of new knowledge in education, the awards are presented annually in the areas of curriculum, instruction, and supervision.

The abstracts will be reviewed by a panel of professors and practitioners and judged by the following criteria:

- significance of the topic,
- conceptual framework,
- research design,
- potential significance and outcome,
- quality of writing.

Those applying must submit 4 copies of the dissertation abstract, not to exceed 10 double-spaced typed

pages (including bibliography and tables) between September 1 and November 15, 1990. The abstract should indicate *only* the title and category of the dissertation—not the author or the institution. Completed packages should contain the following information:

- name, business and home addresses, and telephone numbers;
- title of dissertation and date completed;
- category of the dissertation (curriculum, instruction, or supervision);
- name of the college/university and the department that conferred the doctorate;

- name, mailing address, and telephone number of major advisor.

Send packages to Lisa Street, Project Facilitator, ASCD, 1250 N. Pitt Street, Alexandria, VA 22314-1403—they must be postmarked no later than November 15, 1990. Winners will be notified by February 1, 1991, and will present their papers during a special session at ASCD's Annual Conference in San Francisco, March 16–19, 1991. Each will receive a plaque and a two-year complimentary comprehensive membership in ASCD. In addition, a luncheon in honor of the winners will be held at the conference. □
