## 2012 Application to Join the Whole Child Network of Schools

Current educational practice and policy focus overwhelmingly on academic achievement measured by standardized, mandated tests. This achievement is but one element of student learning and development and only a part of any complete system of educational accountability. ASCD's Whole Child Initiative ([www.ascd.org/wholechild](http://www.ascd.org/wholechild)) is an association-wide effort to change the conversation about education from a focus on narrowly defined academic achievement to one that promotes the development of children who are **healthy, safe, engaged, supported, and challenged** within a *sustainable approach to education and community engagement*. We seek to redefine what a successful learner is and how we measure success within our schools and communities. ASCD is helping educators, families, community members, and policymakers move from envisioning the education of the whole child to acting on it. Our children deserve it. Our schools and communities need it. Our future demands it.

In May, ASCD will select a small group of schools from across the United States and Canada to become part of our Whole Child Network (WCN). WCN Schools in the network will receive implementation support through a three-school-year grant cycle to ensure a *sustainable, comprehensive approach*. This approach is based on research demonstrating that a comprehensive approach that engages all stakeholders creates sustainable, meaningful outcomes for students, including—but not limited to—increased academic achievement.

The schools chosen for the WCN will commit to a comprehensive school improvement process that will use the Whole Child Tenets—**healthy, safe, engaged, supported, and challenged**—and their [indicators](#) (PDF) as their sustainable approach.

**ASCD's WCN is open to all schools (e.g., public, charter, private) of any grade level within the United States and Canada.**

### Benefits

To support the implementation of a whole child approach, each ASCD WCN school will receive

- A \$10,000 grant for the 2012–2013 school year, subject to review for renewal in the subsequent two school years. Grant renewal and continued participation in the Whole Child Network will be contingent upon the school's demonstrated progress and available funds.
- One full day of on-site training facilitated in partnership with ASCD's WCN staff to introduce the whole child approach ("Whole Child 101") within the school community.

Each WCN school will also receive individualized support from ASCD in developing a plan to implement a whole child approach to education in their schools, including a needs assessment. The implementation will be customized using both face-to-face training and virtual and print services, tools, and products that address the various needs identified by the assessment, such as instructional program improvements, job-embedded professional development, student support, health and safety, and teacher/leader effectiveness. As a result of this support and training, schools will be able to

- Make the instructional and student support changes necessary to support school improvement efforts.
- Build a culture of success in school and develop opportunities to expose students to college and career options and guidance.
- Create opportunities for teachers and other staff to learn about, practice, implement, and evaluate research-based strategies that address identified problems and are aligned to school goals.
- Establish practices to develop the conditions for learning within a positive school culture and climate.

Other benefits for WCN schools include

- An all-expenses paid trip to ASCD's 2013 Annual Conference in Chicago, Ill., for up to five team members.
- Opportunities to engage in other ASCD networks and events.
- An ASCD Institutional Membership for each school.

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## Requirements

Participating schools will agree to implement a whole child approach, including the following actions:

- Complete a comprehensive, schoolwide pre- and post-assessment based on the tenets and indicators;
- Engage a planning, decision making, and implementation team that is representative of the whole school;
- Conduct an objective comprehensive data review of your assessment results facilitated by ASCD;
- Adopt and implement a planning process;
- Form collaborative, working partnerships with community-based organizations;
- Participate in ongoing professional development with the school team and community;
- Actively participate in all WCN activities, forums, and events;
- Assess student and staff engagement in the school community;
- Use this opportunity to create a sustainable approach to whole child education for your school;
- Participate in an evaluation of the process directed by ASCD.

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## Conditions of Participation

- Selected schools must sign a memorandum of understanding that delineates the requirements for the grant. The principal, school team, district superintendent, and school board chair are required to sign this document. They should review the grant requirements and memorandum of understanding prior to the school's application submission.
- Each selected school must agree to send a team of five members to the 2012 WCN institute in July 2012. Each school's team should reflect a diverse range of constituency groups from within the school and surrounding community. All expenses will be paid by ASCD.

## Selection Criteria

Strong submissions will provide evidence of the applicant's capacity and commitment to become a comprehensive implementer of a whole child approach to education within their school community. Although the continuum ratings are important, it is just as important to show comprehensive thinking in the responses to the questions asked. Responses should reflect the applicant's careful consideration of their placement on the continuum.

## Timeline

Deadline for submission is **April 30, 2012**.

Chosen schools will be notified by **May 15, 2012**, and will be asked for documentation of a school team commitment of participation in the Whole Child Network by May 28, 2012.

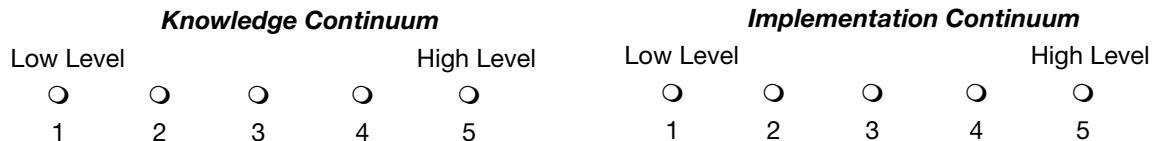

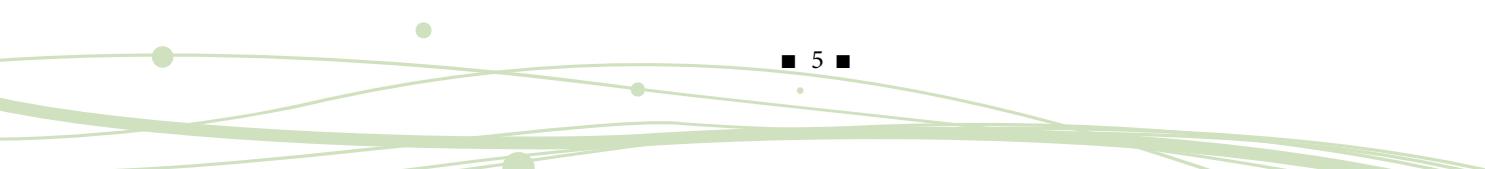
